Spreadsheet Tips

Excel (desktop) vs. **Google Docs** (online, free)

Cells are identified by row and column, e.g. A1.

Writing formulas

- Always start with =
- + - / * ()
- Copying and pasting formulas
- Absolute vs. relative references
A1 \$A1 A\$1 \$A\$1

Functions

Functions are built-in operations that calculate a value based on a range of cells.

= SUM(cell1:cell2)
= AVERAGE (cell1:cell2)
= COUNT (cell1:cell2)
= IF (logical_test,value_if_true, value_if_false)
= COUNTIF (range, criteria)

Other useful tips

- Insert row(s) or column(s)
- Sorting – Data tab
- Fill down (ctrl-d), fill right (ctrl-r)
- Different sheets (tabs)
- Renaming sheets
- Check out the finance-related templates.
